


We are proud, and blessed to have a wonderful community to live, share, worship, work, and play in, and the fall of the year is such a pleasant, and beautiful time in this area to do so.

Please note this will be at Lenape Park (near the ice skating rink), not the high school. In the event of inclement weather we will use the high school cafeteria.


November 14th—Family Bingo Night

TRASH, REFUSE AND RECYCLING

LEAF COLLECTION

eaf collection will begin mid-October and continue through November, weather permitting. Rake leaves into the street along the curb line without blocking or clogging storm drains. Please keep vehicles away from areas where leaves are piled. Leaves will be collected when scheduling allows. There are no set collection days for areas of the Borough. The Public Works crew will follow a specific route and do so cyclically throughout the leaf collection days. Leaves gathered during other than

normal leaf collection days, along with garden debris, must be placed in a Borough trash bag and placed out with your regular trash collection or taken to the recycling center on the 1st Saturday of every month from 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM. Proof of Borough residency is required at the recycling center.



BRUSH COLLECTION

Brush collection is done the first Wednesday of each month. Should the first Wednesday fall on a holiday, brush will be collected the next business day. The January collection will be held on the first Friday of that month to coincide with the collection of Christmas trees. Please contact the Borough office at least 24 hours prior to the collection date to have your name put on a list for collection. Please bind the bunches with string for collection and cut to lengths of 4 feet or less.

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Christmas trees (without wire) are picked up along with recyclables during the first three weeks of January. Wreaths with or without wire will be collected with refuse. Live-balled Christmas trees may be donated for planting in Borough parks.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Refuse and recyclables must be placed at the curb or alley no earlier than 6:00 PM the evening prior to your pickup day, and no later than 7:00 AM the morning of collection. There are no call backs for trash or recycling that is set out after 7:00 AM. Household refuse must be placed in a securely tied Borough disposal bag, which does not exceed the weight of forty (40) pounds for large (green) bags and twenty (20) pounds for small (black) bags. Borough bags or recycling containers cannot remain curbside for more than 24 hours. Borough disposal bags are available at the Borough Office, 620 West Chestnut Street, and at area retailers who display the green hickory tree logo. Disposal of materials resulting from renovation, repair, construction of buildings and structures, or the removal of trees, will not be collected by the Borough. Such items shall be removed by and at the expense of the property owner or the contractor.

If refuse is not collected on your regular trash day due to inclement weather, it will be collected on the next business day (when possible).

RECYCLING CENTER

The Borough Recycling Center, located behind the Perkasie Police Department, at 311 South 9th Street, is for the convenience of **Borough Residents ONLY**. Perkasie Borough staff may ask for identification when you use the Center. There are signs indicating where recyclable materials are to be placed. **No plastic bags, please**. Combine glass, aluminum, tin and plastic (PDE #1-7) containers in the dumpsters that are marked as such and that have metal stairs. Combine newspaper and cardboard and place in the trailer.

Trash and bulky items are not accepted at the Recycling Center. Absolutely NO construction materials, aluminum/plastic siding, window glass, shutters, etc. are accepted at the Recycling Center. No laundry baskets, plastic trash cans, large tin (popcorn) containers, fish

tanks, mirrors or other household materials are accepted. As of June 1, 2010 yard waste (NO GRASS CLIPPINGS) will be accepted on the first Saturday of the month 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please use brown paper bags, lawn and leaf bags or bring a container to be dumped when disposing of yard waste. No plastic bags. Please call the Borough or check the website for additional information.

Perkasie's Newest Police Officers

Nicholas Costa and Ryan Richardson were sworn in by Mayor John Hollenbach at the August 4 Borough Concil meeting. Officers Costa and Richardson were chosen an original field of 53 candidates.

Thinking About a Generator?

Super-storm Sandy's destructive path caused many residents to think about installing a portable generator in case electricity service is interrupted.

You are reminded that an electrical permit is necessary before a generator can be installed.

While generators come in handy when severe storms knock out power, they need to be operated safely. You can't see or smell the deadly carbon monoxide produced by a generator and it can kill quickly.

According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, one generator can produce as much carbon monoxide as hundreds of cars.

Here are some tips for using a portable generator:

- Do not use indoors, or in a garage, basement, or shed.
- Use generators outside, away from windows, doors, and vents or any other opening in the house.
- Make sure you have a working carbon monoxide alarm.

Smoke Alarm Safety

- 1. Install smoke alarms inside every bedroom, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home including the basement.
- 2. Test all smoke alarms every month by using the test button.
- 3. Replace all smoke alarms every 10 years or sooner if they do not respond properly when tested.





What is Storm Water Runoff?

One of the most significant, yet unrecognized groups of water contaminants is storm water pollutants. When it rains, storm water runs over yards, streets, roads, highways, parking lots, parks, and playgrounds, carrying with it everything in its path, including debris and pollutants. Eventually, the water will travel to a stream, either over land or via a storm drain. Storm drains are frequently located alongside streets and parking lots. Unlike sanitary sewers that divert water to a treatment plant directly from your home, storm drains lead directly to surrounding lakes and rivers without any type of treatment. All the debris and pollutants that were picked up by storm water runoff end up in your lakes and streams!

Where Does the Pollution Come From?

Most contaminants are made up of common items used by residents, businesses and visitors, such as fertilizers, car oils and greases, yard clippings, soil, and pet wastes. Below are some tips you can follow to help keep pollution from entering lakes and streams via storm water runoff.

Tips to Keep Your Rivers, Lakes and Streams Clean

- Never dump anything down a storm drain!
- Use an oil pan when changing oil to keep fluids off the pavement. Check local body shops and quick lubes to find a place to appropriately dispose of used oil.
- Bag pet waste and dispose of it in a trash can.
- Leave grass clippings on your lawn as an alternate nutrient to fertilizer. If a fertilizer is necessary, choose a slow-release product and test your soil to find out how much fertilizer your lawn actually needs.
- Wash your car on your lawn so excess water, chemicals, and dirt is filtered through the lawn.
- Keep household hazardous wastes, such as harsh cleaners, paint, car fluids, and batteries from entering lakes and streams by disposing at a household hazardous waste center. Try using environmentally-safe alternatives or recipes with non-hazardous ingredients.
- Use a broom rather than a hose to clean up grass clippings and dirt.
- Keep a trash bag in your car... and use it!

SNOW SAFETY

We hope that the winter will be milder than last year, but just in case we get an early snow; you can assist your road crew by being prepared when a severe winter storm is predicted.

Remove your portable basketball rims from the street, per Borough ordinance. Borough crews will not be responsible for damage to these items.

Make sure your mailbox is six inches away from the face of the curb. If you have questions, call the Perkasie post office.

Do not park your car on snow emergency routes or you could be fined or towed.

Be sure your car is properly winterized with a full tank of gas, sufficient treads on the tires, clean windshields, headlights, and brake lights and a fully equipped emergency kit.

If you are at work and it starts to snow:

Stay there. Don't try to rush home to beat the traffic. By waiting until your regular dismissal time, you enable the road crews to plow and salt the roads in preparation for your departure.

If your company plans an early dismissal, try to stagger the dismissal times. Staggered dismissals are more effective and help to eliminate bus and roadway overcrowding.

When it is time to drive home:

Always wear your seatbelt.

Turn on your headlights and reduce your speed.

Do not pass or get between trucks plowing in a "plow line." Remain at least six car lengths behind an operating snow plow or a truck that is salting.

Take special precautions on roads, that look wet but are actually frozen, often referred to as black ice.

If you become stranded, do not leave your vehicle. Instead, keep a down-wind window cracked, run the motor ten minutes each hour to stay warm and at the same time listen to the radio for updates. While waiting for help to arrive, do minor exercise to boost circulation.

If you skid, don't panic. Take your foot off the gas and don't hit the brake– turn your wheel into the direction your car is skidding– do not brake until your car is going straight.

If a roadway is closed off by cones or barricades, do not move them or go around them. The barricades have been placed for a reason and you will be putting yourself and others in danger if you proceed into a closed off area.

No matter what size vehicle you have, obey all the rules of the road.

Plan on having the tools and plans in place if disaster should strike. **Get a Kit of Emergency Supplies:**

- Water, one gallon per person per day
- Food, at least a three-day supply of non-perishable food
- Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Filter mask or cotton t-shirt to filter air
- Moist towelettes for sanitation
- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Manual can opener
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape
- Garbage bags and plastic ties
- Unique family needs, such as daily prescription medications, infant formula, important family documents




